For centuries, Christians from around the world have celebrated Advent. This Christmas, we will join Christians from across the globe to celebrate. Advent reflects upon the time of waiting for the first coming of Jesus. Jesus arrived with humility, as a helpless child, to save His people, and to save the world. Advent also tells a story of prophecy, fulfillment, and God's faithfulness to His people.

This Christmas we'll prepare our hearts for Christmas by reflecting on our need for the Savior, and we will look ahead to the second coming of Jesus. Advent makes our celebration of Jesus' birth on Christmas day more spectacular and more meaningful.

Practicing Advent as a family is simple: each Sunday, light a candle, read a scripture passage, reflect on it together, and enjoy a Christmas hymn. (You'll start with one candle on the first week and end with five lit candles on Christmas Day). Spend time together to marvel at His eternal offer of hope, peace, love, and joy!

- 2. How does committed love cost you something?
- 3. How has God revealed his love for all people through Jesus?
- 1. How is Jesus' kingdom different from the world?
- 2. What is the difference between happiness and joy? What often robs you of joy?
- 3. How does Jesus' reign as king bring lasting joy?
- 1. What inconveniences or hardships can you find in the story of Jesus' birth? How do these reveal God's amazing love for us? Who was first invited to meet Jesus? Why is that significant?
