

With an increased focus on our "Give It All Away" monthly initiative, we're committed to giving up to \$20,000 per month to other organizations and ministry partners.







- ANOTHER CLEAN AUDIT indicating that our financial reporting and practices meet a high standard of integrity.
- DEBT REDUCTION

We were able to carry through with plans to pay down the church's mortgage more aggressively for the fiscal year 2022. Plans to accelerate debt reduction will reduce our loan payoff by eight years. This will save the church more than \$1,250,000 in interest over the remaining life of the loan.

Vineyard leadership deeply values transparency about the stewardship (Bible-speak for "money management") of the finances of our church. We are incredibly grateful for the generosity displayed by God's people, and we are called to manage those investments in the Kingdom of God well.



The pie chart is a representation of the Body of Christ at the Vineyard—all working together in our areas of strength to accomplish the mission God has given us.


