Helping Kids Understand Communion

The act of taking communion at Vineyard Cincinnati is an important part of our worship experience with God. We believe that any believer – any person who has given their life to Jesus and chosen to follow him - can serve and receive communion.

When we take communion, we remember that Jesus gave his life to cleanse us of sin and provide a promise of eternal life, bringing the kingdom of God to us in a real and personal way. Communion can happen at church, in a small group setting, at meetings or in our homes.

God is able to speak to our hearts in many ways through communion:

- Remembering and being thankful for what Jesus has done for us
- Understanding forgiveness and the power to live free from sin
- Understanding the healing work God does through Jesus
- Experiencing the connection we have with others in the body of Christ.

Having communion together is a great family experience. At home, read and talk about these Bible passages with your child, and worship God together as you partake of the elements.

3. Read Matthew 28:16-20.

Matthew 28:16-20 English Standard Version (ESV)

16 Now the eleven disciples went to Galilee, to the mountain to which Jesus had directed them. 17 And when they saw him they worshiped him, but some doubted. 18 And Jesus came and said to them, "All authority in heaven and on earth has been given to me. 19 Go therefore and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, 20 teaching them to observe all that I have commanded you. And behold, I am with you always, to the end of the age."

Who said we should baptize believers? What did he say in vs. 19?

4. Read Romans 6:3-4 (Older children read through verse 7)

Romans 6:3-7 English Standard Version (ESV)

3 Do you not know that all of us who have been baptized into Christ Jesus were baptized into his death? 4 We were buried therefore with him by baptism into death, in order that, just as Christ was raised from the dead by the alory of the Father, we too might walk in newness of life. 5 For if we have been united with him in a death like his. we shall certainly be united with him in a resurrection like his. 6 We know that our old self was crucified with him in order that the body of sin might be brought to nothing, so that we would no longer be enslaved to sin. 7 For one who has died has been set free[b] from sin.

When you are baptized, you are remembering what Jesus did for us. Going under the water shows you believe that Jesus died with your sins and was buried. Coming up out of the water shows that you believe Jesus rose up from the dead. Jesus gives us a brand new life. God's life gives us power over...

OK... LET'S DO THIS!



Here's the rundown on how baptisms will work this weekend.

- Arrive at **Community Room** in the Atrium **30 minutes** before the service in which you're being baptized, along with whoever is baptizing you. If you would prefer, a member of the baptism team would be happy to do the honors–just let us know and we'll pair you up.
- Get changed into the clothes you'll wear for baptism.
 - Shorts & t-shirt work great (dark-colored please!)
 - Flip flops or barefoot
 - Don't worry about glasses—you can leave them behind or hand them to a member of the baptism team before you go in the dunk tank and they'll hand them back to you.
 - Bring a towel with you. We'll take it from you before you get in the water and hand it back when you're done..
 - Bring your change of dry clothes and leave them in the Community Room.
 - Hair dryers are available.
- **Ready to GO!** When worship kicks off, we need to be lined up to enter the auditorium, along with the person baptizing you. There is no particular order you must be in.
- Get changed & re-join the service. Once you're baptized, you'll return to the changing rooms & can rejoin the celebration in progress when you are ready. Children can join their Vineyard Kid's classes, though depending on the time they come, some groups may already be in small groups. If they are going to attend a Vineyard Kid's class, please get a nametag sticker BEFORE the service!
- **Celebrate!** Stop by the baptism selfie area just outside the community room to commemorate the special day with your family and friends.
