
### STORE REMODEL & WAREHOUSE IMPROVEMENTS

This year we were able to remodel and enlarge our clothing and food stores through a combination of a grants and private donations. We used qualifying funds from the Freestore Foodbank Hunger Walk to purchase a refrigerator and freezer unit for our food pantry. The refrigerator and freezer puts the items that need to stay cold right there in the store. One of the many advantages of shopping at the Healing Center is that we invite people

to choose their ow groceries when they visit us, empowering them to make food decisions that are right for them.

With much excitement we were able to obtain a cardboard baler. Instead of paying to recycle all the boxes that come through our warehouse, we were able to sell 15 tons of cardboard bales to generate additional income for the Healing Center.

Over 700 people signed up for the VIRTUAL Hunger Walk, the annual 5K run/walk fundraiser by the Freestore Foodbank, raising more than \$62,000! Money raised in the Hunger Walk allows us to purchase food for the entire year.



\$684,000 of products donated by Kroger. \$900,000 of in-kind donations received from various donors. **4,000** pairs of brand-new socks donated by Bombas were given to our guests.

Over 240 bicycles were repaired to distribute to children and to adults who need transportation assistance. \$50,000 of brand-new baby items were donated by one single corporate donor Dozens of families with newborns received much-needed cribs, car seats, etc.

Over 500 children's books given away in 2020

Dozens of brand new steel toe boots were donated by a corporate partner.

They allowed our guests to start new jobs with the proper required footwear.
