Each year since then, we have seen our community grow and expand. From the development of services such as the Student Run bold steps to advance our mission to Inspire Hope, Foster Growth, Meet Needs, Build Relationships, and Reflect God's Love.

> In 2022, God opened new doors and provided unique opportunities for the Healing Center to extend its impact in the community. This year, we partnered with United Way as a systems change partner, working with other nonprofits to improve systems of care and help solve the issues around poverty in our region. We expanded the Healing Center Advisory Board to include professionals in the areas of court corrections, education, human resources, marketing and development, and mental health. Through the 19th annual Hunger Walk, we raised a record breaking \$100,000 to com-

Student-Run Free Clinic and Life Forward



The University of Cincinnati Student Run Free Clinic (SRFC) provides free medical care at the Healing Center for adults who do not have health insurance. In 2022, we expanded our health care services by hosting our first head and neck cancer screening event. We also offered a flu shot clinic for the Student Run Free Clinic patients.

Since 2017 the Healing Center has been the Springdale location for **Life Forward**, offering free pregnancy tests, ultrasounds, and support to women and couples facing unplanned pregnancies.
